Greetings Wagion!





## **A Call For Unity**





It feels like the world is in crisis. So much division, violence, turmoil, and lack of morality are present in the world, the United States, and even in communities as small as the council we call home. With this being said, there is one thing that we, as Scouts, can do. We all come from different walks of life, different lifestyles, different communities and families, and we all bring diverse opinions, beliefs, and feelings. And yet, as Scouts, we come together in the same organization to build up the next generation of leaders, to help young men and women to grow into mature and responsible adults, and most importantly, to serve one another to the best of our abilities. Serving one another unites us to one cause. And herein lies the solution: we can be that example of unity that the world so desperately needs! We, as Order of the Arrow members, are given a unique responsibility of representing the Scouting program and bringing the best and brightest parts of it to our communities. And, with this unique responsibility, it is more imperative today than ever before to stand united as a group of Scouts, a family of volunteers, that can stand strong even in the face of increasing division. We have a call for unity.

And so how do we answer this call? Well, this is up to interpretation, and each of us should take time to discern how we can stand united in the Scouting program and use it to be a witness of selfless unity to our communities.

Some material that touches on this call to unity can be found in Pope John XXIII's Encyclical on Truth, Unity and Peace, in a Spirit of Charity. While this encyclical does mainly touch on the roles of unity in the church, it has very similar parallels to the Scouting program, and even setting religious beliefs aside, there are some great words of wisdom that I feel we could use in such a time as this.

This encyclical calls all people to attain truth, unity and peace, which all desire, even though prejudices, great difficulties, and many obstacles stand in the way of their achievement. I believe that our Scouting program promotes these same objectives to all Scouts when following the Scout Oath and Law.

Pope John XXIII believes that "it is possible for us to attain natural truth by virtue of our intellects. But all cannot do this easily; often their efforts will result in a mixture of truth and error." As trustworthy citizens who promise to do our duty to God and country, we must come to the realization that we will never be able to attain perfect truth 100% of the time. As humans, we are imperfect and have a mixture of truth and error. It is important for us to understand this and to accept that we are not made to perfectly know the truth, but rather to accept that we must depend on other people. We must be slow to speak and quick to listen in order to truly discern and reveal the truth and to promote this truth throughout our Scouting program. As an Order, we have many checks and balances in place, along with many leaders who collaborate, which helps our lodge to function in truth as we work together and share our imperfection with one another for the betterment of the lodge as a whole.

Stemming from this, we must realize that in truth, we must work together as a lodge and a Brotherhood. An interesting point in the encyclical states the following: "God created men as brothers, not foes. He gave them the earth to be cultivated by their toil and labor. Each and every man is to enjoy the fruits of the earth and receive from it his sustenance and the necessities of life. The various nations are simply communities of men, that is, of brothers. They are to work in brotherly cooperation for the common prosperity of human society, not simply for their own particular goals."

This statement encompasses much of what our program sets out to do. We bring young men and women together to labor and cultivate the earth, and in doing this exact thing, we work for common prosperity. Working in cheerful service as a Brotherhood brings us unity, as we become a community of people working toward the prosperity of the Scouting program and of the world. We work toward a world centered in service and brotherly cooperation, and so unite ourselves to one another.

Even in the song of our Order, we sing "weld tightly every link", which in turn shares this same sentiment: that we are not merely a gathering of people, but a Brotherhood bound together by service and fellowship. We, as Scouts, become united as a chain does in the fire, and are transformed into something stronger than we could ever think imaginable. Channeling this unity that we receive from one another brings us peace.

What is the most effective way to live this life of truth, unity, and peace you may ask? Well Pope John XXIII shares this answer when saying that we should all "strive to preserve in ourself and to bring forth in others, be they of high or low degree, the queen and mistress of all the virtues, charity. The salvation we hope for is to be expected primarily from a great outpouring of charity. That charity is always ready to spend itself in the interest of others." And so here is our call to action. In order to establish this unity, we must do what we do best: Cheerfuly serve!

While the world may feel divided, and while it may feel easy to lose hope, we must remember that this is only one moment in time, one season on earth, and that the best thing we can do in this time is to remove ourselves from the worldly desires that compete for our attention, and rather serve our fellow man in the hopes of a world full of truth, unity, and peace.

"Lord God of peace, hear our prayer!

We have tried so many times and over so many years to resolve our conflicts by our own powers and by the force of our arms. How many moments of hostility and darkness have we experienced; how much blood has been shed; how many lives have been shattered; how many hopes have been buried... But our efforts have been in vain.

Now, Lord, come to our aid! Grant us peace, teach us peace; guide our steps in the way of peace. Open our eyes and our hearts, and give us the courage to say: "Never again war!"; "With war everything is lost". Instill in our hearts the courage to take concrete steps to achieve peace.

Lord, you created us and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace; enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our brother or sister. Make us sensitive to the plea of our citizens who entreat us to turn our weapons of war into implements of peace, our trepidation into confident trust, and our quarreling into forgiveness.

Keep alive within us the flame of hope, so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words "division", "hatred" and "war" be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother", and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam! Amen."
